Agility

There will be two days of agility trials on October 30-31, 2006, at the Sonoma County Fairgrounds in Santa Rosa, CA, which is about 10 minutes from the main show site at the Doubletree in Rohnert Park. Entries open at 8:00 a.m. on September 11, 2006 and close at 6:00 p.m. on October 16, 2006. The premium list will be mailed on September 1. Online entries and the premium list will also be available at www.abbadogs.com.

Judging will begin at 8:00 a.m. each day. Rings will be outside on grass. In the case of inclement weather, the rings will be moved to Lyttle Cow Palace at the fairgrounds, which is under cover on dirt, and the start time will be noon, Monday only. Start time on Tuesday will remain at 8:00 a.m. Electronic timers will be used.

There are more direct flights into SFO. Traveling to the host hotel is a toss-up in terms of distance from either SFO or Oakland, but the Oakland-Doubletree route is all freeway where the SFO-Doubletree route is both freeway and surface streets (there is no freeway through San Francisco). This may make the trip from Oakland shorter in terms of time – however, during commute hours, all bets are off. Avoid those hours if you can, especially if you're arriving on Friday. If you can't, be prepared for a long and tedious drive (in other words, bring snacks and, if you're alone, a good book on tape).

Airport Transportation

Car/Van Rentals

San Francisco International http://www.flysfo.com/transport/rentalcars/gt_rcr_carcenter.asp: SFO's Rental Car Center allows travelers to pick up and drop off rental cars at one convenient, central location. Alamo, Avis, Budget, Dollar, Enterprise, Hertz, National and Thrifty car rental counters are located on the fourth floor of the SFO Rental Car Center.

To access the Rental Car Center from the Airport terminals, take the [AirTrain](#) Blue Line. AirTrain, SFO's fully automated people mover system, operates 24 hours every day and provides convenient and frequent service throughout SFO. AirTrain stations are located in all terminals, parking garages, the Rental Car Center and SFO's BART station.

Oakland International http://www.oaklandairport.com/car_rentals.shtml: Rental Car Shuttle buses operate between the terminals and the Rental Car Center, every 10 minutes; however, it operates "on demand" between 1:30 a.m. and 4:30 a.m.

While the Rental Car Center is open 24 hours a day, travelers should check with their car rental agency's reservation center for hours of operation at OAK and make arrangements for special arrival and departure requests.

Sacramento International <http://www.sacairports.org/int/terminal/rental.htm>: All rental car agencies at Sacramento International Airport (SMF) are located in one centralized area. Shuttle busses frequently transport passengers between the rental car terminal and the rental car shuttle stops in front of each

terminal. This terminal serves Alamo, Avis, Budget, Enterprise, Dollar, Hertz and National as well as serves as a pick up point for two local off-airport agencies.

Bus Service

There is bus service, the Sonoma County Airport Express, <http://www.airportexpressinc.com>, from the San Francisco and Oakland airports. They do allow pets in carriers, but they have to ride in the cargo hold. We'll continue to check out other options as well, but if you're traveling with dogs, your best bet is to rent a car or van.

Event Sites

Conformation, obedience and rally will take place on the lawns on the south side of the host hotel, the Doubletree (see below under Lodging).

Agility will take place at the Sonoma County Fairgrounds in Santa Rosa, about five miles from the Doubletree. These will be outdoor trials on grass, although we have the option of moving indoors if it rains. For more information, see the Agility section above.

Herding will take place outdoors at the Herding4Ewe Training Center, <http://www.herding4ewe.com>, 5212 Allendale Road, Vacaville, which is about 70 miles from the Doubletree.

Herding

There will be two days of herding tests and trials on October 28-29, 2006, at Herding 4 Ewe Training Facility, 5212 Allendale Rd, Vacaville, CA, which is about an hour and 15 minutes from the main show site at the Doubletree in Rohnert Park. Entries open at 8:00 a.m. on September 11, 2006 and close at 6:00 p.m. on October 11, 2006. The premium list will be mailed on September 1. Online entries and the premium list will also be available at www.infodog.com.

There will be tests and trials on sheep; trials only on ducks. Rings will be outside, so please be prepared with both shade and rain gear. To volunteer or for more information, contact the Herding Trial chair, Vicki Northway, drifan@hotmail.com.

Directions

From the West: Take I-80 E to 505 N. Take 505 to the Allendale exit. Right on Allendale to 5212 Allendale (1.2 miles; driveway is on right). Look for big wooden posts with wrought iron gates. Look for herding trial signs.

From the East: Take I-80 West Dixon Ave exit. Right on Dixon Ave, go to end (3 miles). Right on Meridian Rd. Go .4 mile to Allendale. Turn left (street sign is hard to see) and go to 5212 Allendale, .2 mile. Driveway on the left. Look for big wooden posts with wrought iron gates. Look for herding trial signs.

From Vacaville Best Western (host hotel for herding): Start out going .1 mile SW on E. Monte Vista Ave toward Allison Dr. Turn L onto Allison. Merge onto I-80 E towards Sacramento (.9 miles). Merge onto I-505 N towards Winters/Redding (5.8 miles). Take Allendale Rd exit. Right on Allendale to 5212 Allendale (1.2 miles; driveway is on right). Look for big wooden posts with wrought iron gates. Look for herding trial signs.

This event is being hosted by the Peer Education Committee (Robert Nesbitt, Chair). It's the first installment of **Pembroke Welsh Corgi University**, a multi-installment breed certification program. This introduction to the breed will consist of a roundtable discussion anchored by Gayle Garvin and Michael Sauve. They will present a look at some of the first Pembrokes imported to the U.S. and the first U.S. champions, with emphasis placed on the evolution of the Pembroke in this country. It will include mention of the breeders that have influenced the breed since it arrived here and the inception and growth of the PWCCA. This is going to be an informative, informal group discussion/presentation where active participation by those attending will be encouraged.
